To end the term we will look at the geographical features of North America and look at webpage design in computing.


During the Spring Term we will continue with our over-arching theme of 'Responsibility and Conviction but this time delve into the Concept of Courage. This will be supported by our topic of WW2 where we look at how people used courage to help them find strength during difficult times. As always, we will use books as the vehicle to help us explore these themes and read across the curriculum to support our learning. Our first book will be awarding winning text, 'When the Sky Falls' by Phil Earle. The book is based in London 1941; war is raging. One angry boy has been sent to the city, where bombers rule the skies. There, Joseph will live with Mrs F, a gruff woman with no fondness for children. Her only loves are the rundown zoo she owns and its mighty silverback gorilla, Adonis. As the weeks pass, bonds deepen and secrets are revealed, but if the bombers set Adonis rampaging free, will either of them be able to end the life of the one thing they truly love?
