As we set sail into our final term of primary school, we will be looking at the concept of 'choice'. To support this topic, we will be looking at migration and immigration using the text *Windrush Child*. In this heart-stopping adventure, Benjamin Zephaniah shows us what it was like to be a child of the Windrush generation.

As we progress through the term we will be thinking about how the choices we make now can impact our future and using the theme of 'Climate Change' to consider the impact of choices. Our class text will be 'Floodland'; a gripping, prizewinning novel about a girl surviving in a devastated world. In this story we will imagine that a few years from now England is covered by water, and Norwich is an island. This is a story of courage and determination that is handled with warmth and humanity.



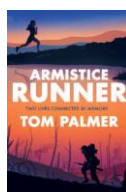
Our residential visit to London will take place in the Summer term. Payments can now be made via installments on Parent Pay.

At the start of the Summer term, many of our Maths and English lessons will be tailored to ensure children are prepared for their SATs which begin w/c 13th May 2024. These whole class lessons, along with boosters will be used to target content to ensure children are secure in all of their foundational knowledge before beginning their secondary phase of education. Wider curriculum subjects will continue to add depth and thought-provoking opportunities to our theme of 'Choice'. We will study Climate Change in greater detail, look at how immigration has changed over the past 100 years along with a futuristic topic within computing looking at game design and variables. In PSHE, we will look at how our bodies have changed and continue to change through different stages of development and focus on transition activities preparing children for the Year 7. All of this, along with our class residential to London; what an action packed term!

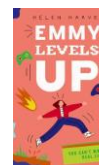


Book recommendations for this term. Borrow from school or pop to your local library!
